Program Description: Dependency Mediation is an informal and confidential process where the family, social worker, attorneys, and other people in the case meet with a trained mediator. The mediator helps the parties explore ways to resolve differences and make a plan that everybody agrees is safe and best for the child.

Mediation offers a cooperative approach to dependency cases, with the goal of moving cases forward quickly in a non-adversarial setting, avoiding contested trials. The court generally allots three hours for each mediation session. On the day of mediation, the mediator provides each parent a brief overview of the mediation process. All parties sign a confidentiality agreement prior to the mediation and all parties are given an opportunity to be heard during mediation. If an agreement is reached, a written agreement is printed and signed, with each party receiving a copy. The agreement is then forwarded to the judge. After reviewing the agreement, the judge signs it and enters a court order formalizing the agreement in the case.

Accessible Services and Support: Four contract mediators provide services as part of the Second Judicial District Court's participation in the Statewide Juvenile Dependency Mediation Program.
